- At the entrance of the Planetarium Dome the following items were handed over to you:
 - 1. An envelope marked B.
 - 2. A pouch containing a stopwatch, a head torch and a green pen.
 - 3. A writing board
- Please verify the Contestant Code printed on envelope marked B
- The Question Paper, two Sky Maps, and Summary Answersheets are kept inside the smaller envelope S. You are allowed to open this envelope (S) only when the whistle is blown to mark the start of the examination. The exam time (1 hour) starts from this point.
- There are two questions in this exam: OP01 and OP02. You will have **15 minutes** to read the question paper, and make any preliminary plans for your observation. During this time, lights in the planetarium dome will be on.
- Time for question OP01 is **15 minutes**:
 - Dark adaptation and familiarisation with the sky: 3 minutes
 - Main task: 12 minutes
- Time for question OP02 is 10 minutes.
- A whistle will be blown at the start and at the end of each question.
- There will be a break of **2 minutes** between the questions.
- The time remaining for each question will be displayed on the dome at one minute intervals. Please pay attention.
- At the end of the projection, lights will be turned on again, and you will have **18 minutes** to finalise your answers.
- If you use a pencil to mark or trace something, please overwrite by the green pen (supplied in your pouch) before submission to improve clarity.
- At any time during the examination, you may stand up at your place and/or turn around. However, you are not allowed to move out of your place.
- You must maintain strict silence throughout the examination.

• At the end of the examination:

- Check that you have correctly written your Contestant Code and page numbers on all used sheets.
- Arrange your sheets in the following order:
 Summary Answersheet of (OP01), sky map Map-OP01, Working Sheet(s) used for (OP01),
 Summary Answersheet of (OP02), sky map Map-OP02, Working Sheet(s) used for (OP02).
- Place the bunch of the above sheets inside the smaller envelope S. Both Summary Answersheets must be placed inside the envelope S irrespective of whether you have used them or not.
- Only the contents of the smaller envelope S will be evaluated. Any sheet that is not placed inside this envelope will not be evaluated.
- Place the smaller envelope S inside the bigger envelope B.
- All other sheets, namely, Instruction Sheet(s), Question Paper(s), Data Sheet(s) and unused Working Sheet(s) should be placed directly inside the bigger envelope B.
- Tie the thread seal on the envelope B.
- Place the head torch, stopwatch, and the green pen inside the pouch.
- Carry the envelope [B], the writing board, and the pouch to the exit and drop them in the designated boxes.
